Software

dopplr (R Package with Ryan Kennedy)

This package generates and evaluates synthetic survey data. It can simulate responses based on real respondents' profiles, create synthetic respondents and datasets that mirror the structure and distributions of real data (for cases where original data cannot be publicly shared), and generate multiple synthetic data variations. Additional features include weighting synthetic respondents, quality checks, and synthetic data tuning.

citehelpR (R Package)

This package checks and converts references in academic documents. It uses configurable fuzzy-matching to flag potentially missing in-text citations and reference list entries, allowing users to adjust the matching sensitivity to account for minor inconsistencies and human error (e.g., formatting, typos). This package can also convert standalone bibliographies between APA and Chicago citation styles.

R Framework for AI-Assisted Interviews (designed for Second Raven with Ryan Kennedy)

End-to-end R framework that streamlines data cleaning and analysis, performs quality checks, and generates custom newsletters and PowerPoint presentations using large language models.

R Survey Data Processing System (designed for Survey 160)

Proprietary suite of R templates developed to automate survey data preparation, cleaning, and text classification within company research pipelines. Designed for reproducibility and internal consistency across cross-functional teams. I also developed an R-based model designed to detect AI-generated text in free-response survey data.
